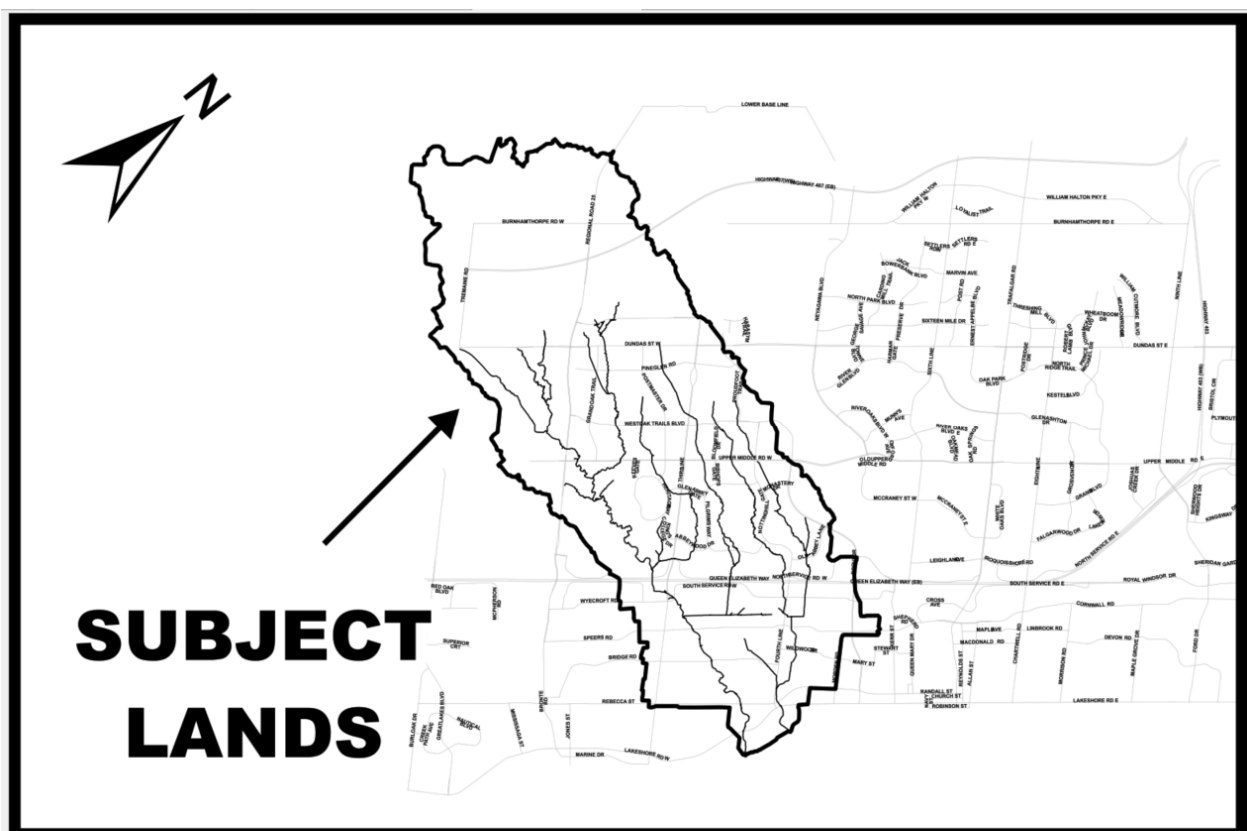

## Notice of Public Information Centre (PIC) Wednesday, November 6th, 2024

### Fourteen Mile Creek and McCraney Creek Flood Mitigation Opportunities Study

The Town of Oakville is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment to identify and evaluate flood mitigation opportunities for the Fourteen Mile Creek and McCraney Creek watershed, spanning from Lake Ontario to north of Dundas Street.



There are several different ways properties and buildings can flood. This study focuses on riverine flooding, which is flooding caused when creeks overflow their banks and spill into adjacent low-lying areas during heavy rainfall events.

The study included a thorough investigation of flood-prone sites along the creeks to determine the most viable and effective flood mitigation alternatives. It has assessed the extent of flooding, identified and evaluated mitigation options, and is recommending preliminary preferred solutions.

#### The Process

This study is being undertaken as a Master Plan level study under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Process, approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. As part of the EA process, public engagement is undertaken to review project problems/opportunities, define existing conditions, review alternative solutions, and identify preliminary preferred alternative solutions. This is the third and final PIC being planned for the study.
