The Town of Oakville’s website, oakville.ca, is a helpful resource to find out what’s happening around town, learn about new programs, and access information.

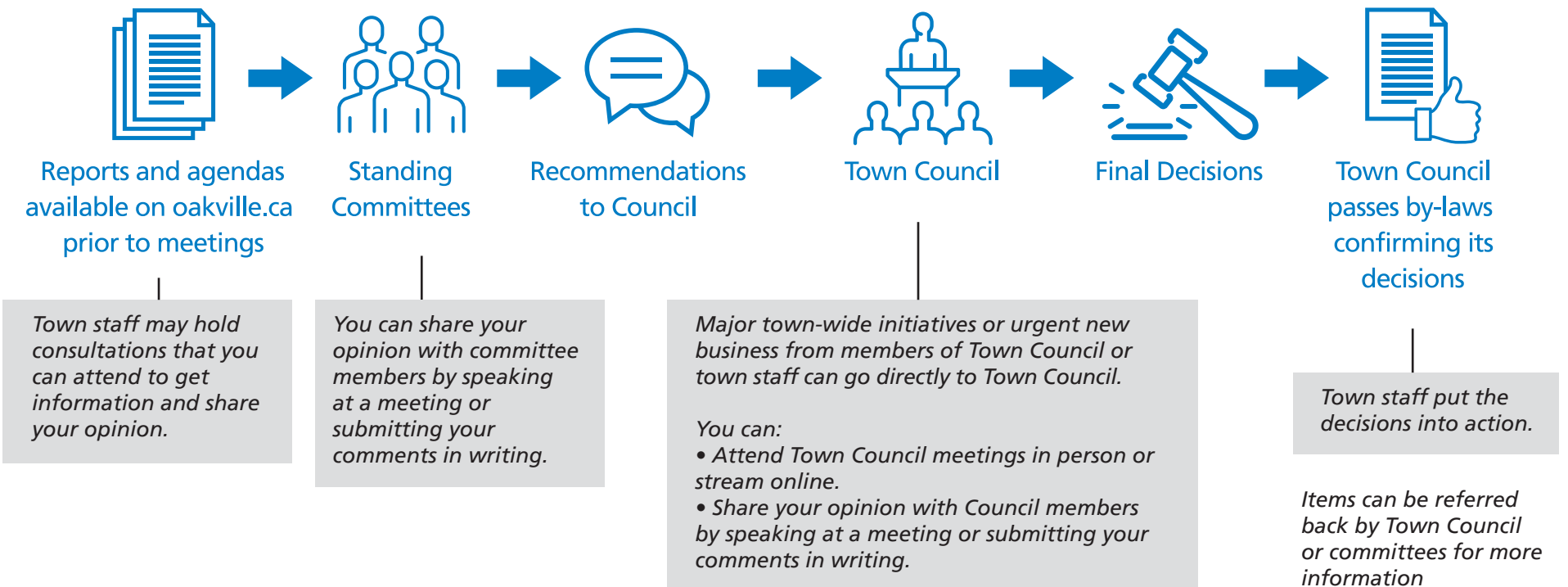
ServiceOakville

311

Managed by Halton Region, 311 is an excellent tool to get information about regional services offered in Oakville, such as garbage pick-up or public health programs. Simply dial 311 on your phone, no area code required.

How decisions are made at the town



Government

Levels of government

The Town of Oakville is your local government, also known as municipal government. In Canada we have federal, provincial, regional, and municipal levels of government. Each level has distinct responsibilities, and they often work together.

Federal

The Government of Canada is responsible for national defense and Canadian Armed Forces, postal service, banking, employment, citizenship and immigration, census, foreign affairs and international trade, agriculture and more.

Provincial

The Government of Ontario is responsible for health, education, driver and vehicle licensing, energy, human rights, natural resources, environment, social services and more.

Regional

The Region of Halton is responsible for recycling and garbage collection, policing, paramedics, community housing, public health services and more. The region serves residents from the Town of Oakville, City of Burlington, Town of Milton and Halton Hills.

Municipal

The Town of Oakville is your local municipal government and is responsible for parks, libraries, local transit, land use planning, roads, streets, sidewalks, traffic signals, fire services, sewers, recreation and culture programs, and more.

Standing committees

Committees are each made up of between four and seven councillors who receive input from the public and make recommendations to Town Council on specific items. Town Council and its committees meet on a four-week cycle throughout the year. Each cycle starts with committee meetings and ends with a full Town Council meeting.

Community Services Committee

The Community Services Committee addresses community service issues including programs, facilities and services available to the public.

Administrative Services Committee

The Administrative Services Committee addresses administrative issues, reviews corporate policies, appoints members of the public to advisory and other committees, and addresses audit and financial reporting processes.

Budget Committee

The Budget Committee annually reviews the town's operating and capital budgets, and makes recommendations on proposed budgets for the upcoming year.

Planning and Development Council

All councillors serve on Planning and Development Council, which addresses planning and development issues including land use, building regulations and public meetings. Planning and Development Council meets within the four-week Council meeting cycle.

Oakville Transit is pleased to offer free rides for kids, youth (0-19) and seniors (65 years and older).

To benefit from this free program, customers must have a PRESTO card and tap when boarding the bus. Kids 0-12 do not require a PRESTO card when accompanied by a parent/guardian.

The free rides apply all day, seven days a week on all Oakville Transit services: Conventional fixed routes, care-A-van and Ride On-Demand (Home to Hub).
